

A chairde gaeil go léir,

As your County Chairperson I feel that it is incumbent upon me to first of all compliment all of our clubs on the magnificent response you have made in your communities to the Covid-19 pandemic for nearly six months now.

To quote a warning issued this week to all sports organisations in the Six Counties from the Dept of Communities

We only have to look at the current situation across the border, where no spectators are allowed into our games, to see what could happen here before we get through our Championships.

Accordingly I sincerely ask the following of our club supporters:-

- don't come to a venue without a ticket received from your club. You won't get in. You will simply be causing unnecessary hassle for our volunteer gatepersons and stewards. If you are unlucky enough not to get a ticket for your club's match remember that you can watch the match at home on Fermanagh GAATV for a pound less!
- when travelling to a match don't car-share with members of another household
- please comply with directions and sanitation protocols put in place by host clubs
- please maintain social distancing between family groups at matches eg 2 empty seats in the stand, no leaning over perimeter fence shoulder to shoulder etc.
- the above also applies to team substitutes on the sideline or in the stand
- don't congregate in groups after matches

I know that most of these measures are alien to our way of life being a sociable people but our future well-being depends on your compliance.

Finally I would like to take this opportunity to thank my fellow County Board Officers, our CCC a tremendous effort to stage our games in these challenging times. I am confident that our host clubs will have the stipulated protocols in place this weekend and I simply ask that you our faithful supporters observe all the Covid Guidelines so that we keep this insidious virus suppressed in our beloved county.





SFC Preview

Derrygonnelly Harps will begin their quest for a sixth New York Cup in a row this weekend and the big question is, can anybody stop them achieving that goal?

The Harps have been consistently the best performers in both league and championship in Fermanagh during this glorious period for the club and they are hotly fancied to keep a tight grip on the cup again in 2020.

The shortened season due to the Covid-19 situation does not seem to have had any effect on Derrygonnelly who will go into the championship sitting top of the Division One table and clearly the team to beat.

Indeed, if anything, the Harps are stronger than they were last season with greater options in attack.

The return of Gary McKenna after an injury plagued 2019 is a big boost while the form shown by teenager Míchéal Glynn in his first season in senior football will be very encouraging for them while a number of other young players who made an impact last year now have another year under their belts.

And those youthful players are surrounded by experienced personnel in the shape of the likes of Ryan Jones, Conall Jones, Eamon McHugh and Michael Jones.

Make no bones about it, Derrygonnelly are going to take a lot of stopping.

First up for them is a repeat of last year's final against Roslea and Peter McGinnity's side always provide a stern test for opponents.

Defensively, they are a well drilled side who are difficult to breakdown with the likes of Niall Cassidy and James McMahon experienced campaigners. Niall Cosgrove provides a good link between defence and attack and in Sean Quigley they have a match winner up front where he should line up with brother Seamus.

They don't carry the same depth though as Derrygonnelly and McGinnity has had to introduce a number of young players this season. On any given day they can be dangerous opponents, but they got the draw that nobody else really wanted.

Ederney are a side who some will see as potential challengers to Derrygonnelly and Mickey Cassidy's side have been among the top teams in the county over the last few years.



Powerful at midfield with former All-Star Marty McGrath still a key cog, and with the guile and energy of Declan McCusker coming from deep, they also have a lively attack where the likes of Mark McCauley, Sean Cassidy, Paul McCusker and Ryan Morris give them plenty of scoring threat.

The St. Joseph's side reached the final two years ago but had no answer to Derrygonnelly and they will have been disappointed to have slipped up at the quarter final stage last year in losing to Belnaleck, when they were again tipped to be the main challengers to the Harps crown.

They have though had a good opening to the league, and they will be keen to make amends for that defeat to Belnaleck when the sides meet again this Friday night.

Belnaleck have come as close as anybody to taking Derrygonnelly's scalp in recent years with Colm Bradley's side seeing a late Darragh McBrien effort tail just wide in last year's semi-final as the game ended in a draw. Belnaleck's rise through the grades has been very impressive and they will only improve now playing Division One football.

Despite the loss of Lee Cullen and Ciaran McBrien who are travelling, they have plenty of quality in the squad in Kane Connor, Che Cullen and Conor McCauley to go along with the youthful Garrett Cavanagh, Darragh McGurn and Garvan Quigley. A strong, physical side, they will give any team problems on their day and if they get over Ederney again they will be live challengers.



One side who have gone about their business quietly and effectively and who could well be the main threat to the Harps six in a row is last season's Intermediate winners, Kinawley.

Indeed, the Brian Boru's have already beaten Derrygonnelly this year in the league and have produced some impressive performances to date. Ollie Fay has taken over the reins this season and they are a side who don't have many weaknesses.

They have an effective system of play, are athletic and aggressive with a good mix of experience and youth with Shaun Doherty and Niall Bogue still playing important roles.



And they have that crucial ingredient of match winners with Tomás Corrigan, Ruairi Corrigan and Hogan Cup winner Tom Keenan all capable of producing a moment of magic.

They do though face a tricky opener against Erne Gaels. The Belleek men have not enjoyed the best of league campaigns so far with only one point gained from their first five games although they have been competitive for long periods in most of those.

Ryan Lyons (travelling) is a big loss for them while county star Ultan Kelm has not featured so far with injury but they still have a good sprinkling of talent in their side in the likes of Barry McCann, Oisín Kelm and Seamus Ryder. Kinawley though may prove a tough nut to crack for the Gaels.

In the other quarter final, it is another repeat of last year as Tempo take on Teemore.

Tempo came through that night with Lorcan McStravick producing a man of the match performance.

The forward has looked sharp again for the Maguires in attack this year although there has been something of an over-reliance on him for scores.

They will also look to county men Aidan Breen, Tiarnan Bogue and Ryan Breen to drive them on.

Teemore suffered relegation from Division One last year but they have regrouped with Barry Owens now in charge and have been in fine form in Division Two. They come into the championship with a 100 per cent record and sitting top of the Division Two table having racked up some big scores.

They have momentum on their side which is important and as always, the Shamrocks are a tough championship opponent.

They will be hoping that the McManus boys, Eoin and Cian, along with Colm McNally and Niall Clarke can help to steer the Shamrocks through to the last four of this year's senior football championship.





Club Éirne *The driving force behind Fermanagh GAA*

Since its re-establishment in 2014, Club Éirne has delivered nearly £750,000 for Fermanagh GAA. This has only been achieved through the unbelievable generosity and support of the GAA community in Fermanagh and further afield.

In 2019 alone, the staggering figure of £225,172 was transferred to Fermanagh GAA in order to help develop Gaelic Games in the county. £100,000 was used to support underage coaching structures and academy squads, with a similar figure being used to offset the ever growing costs of preparing county football and hurling teams. The balance of the money went into the county gym at Lackaboy, maintaining facilities at Lissan and training equipment.

For 2020, Club Éirne have set themselves a target of generating £250,000 for Fermanagh GAA. If this was achieved, that would be an investment of nearly £1 million in recent years. But in order to achieve this target, the continued support of the GAA community is required.

The Intermediate Championship may be looked upon as smaller in profile and publicity wise, but overall this competition once again remains arguably the most competitive of the three domestic competitions to win this season in Fermanagh Club football.

The competition has seen a different winner in the past three seasons with Belcoo (2017), Belnaleck (2018) and Kinawley (2019) all claiming bragging rights in recent seasons.

The Intermediate grade is always seen as one of the hardest to call and to be honest this year is no different with eight sides all blessed with qualities that could see them lift the Championship crown at the end of September.

Devenish made the drop down from Senior Championship with three defeats in a row (Derrygonnelly, Erne Gaels and Teemore) in 2019 condemning the side to the IFC grade. While going the other way are the Junior football champions of 2019 who are Maguiresbridge.

Going into the competition it will be Enniskillen Gaels who will carry the burden as favourites, but with a mix of division 1 and division 2 club teams competing it is hard to gauge in Fermanagh club football when it comes to Championship time just how sides will fare against each other.

Enniskillen Gaels come in with some really impressive displays in Division 1, while the likes of Johnny Cassidy, Callum Jones and Richard O'Callaghan will really prosper in this competition.

Irvinestown have found the going tough in Division 1 this year and they have drawn the short straw of facing Enniskillen in the first round. However, they gave a good account of themselves in the opening league game against Enniskillen and it is quite clear the St Molaise men will be happy to take the underdog tag on Saturday.

Maguiresbridge come up from the Junior Championship and have a tasty looking derby clash with St Patricks Donagh. With the likes of Ciaran Corrigan, Matthew Teague and Daniel Teague then it goes without saying the Bridge have a chance.

Trillick native Sean Donnelly has come in to the St Patricks Donagh hot seat and has found the going tough in division 2, Played 5, Won 2, Draw 1, Lost 2. The likes of Eamon Maguire and Cameron McBrien will need to be on their game, while the free taking of Dara O'Reilly will be crucial.



Belcoo face an opening-round meeting with Lisnaskea which represents a huge game for the two clubs. Belcoo have Shane McCabe at the helm this season and the winner of this game may have a huge saying in where the IFC crown goes this season. Paul McGrath, Niall Leonard and Brian Cox sees the O'Rahilly's laced with experience and the know how to get results.

Peter Clarke's Lisnaskea has quite a young squad at his disposal with the likes of Hayden Lynch, Tom Clarke and Eoin McCabe all catching the eye so far this season in Division 2. An early favourite for the Intermediate title will be knocked out come Saturday in Derrygonnelly. That pretty much shows you how close this Intermediate grade actually is.

The last Quarter Final clash is a bit of a novel pairing with Devenish taking on Aghadrumsee in an early Sunday clash in Brewster Park. Devenish will be new to the IFC surroundings but have players capable of winning games such as Chris O'Brien, Jason Love and the quick footed Ruairi Maguire. The Division 1 side will know that anything short of a performance on Sunday could see them knocked out early on.

Aghadrumsee have been riding high in Division 2 this season with neighbour Pat Cadden taking over at the club. Cadden seems to have the whole club rowing behind him and in players such as Eddie Courtney, Dale Crudden and Sean McManus it is clear they have the nucleus of a really good side. Anything is possible in Brewster Park this coming Sunday.

A huge amount of football will be played between now and Sunday September 27th, the IFC grade should be a fascinating spectacle.


Almost five months on from that defeat, Fermanagh minors now face a return to action when they take on Down in the Ulster Championship in Brewster Park on Sunday 25th October.

Caoga Bliain Ó Shin *Fifty Years Ago*

Fermanagh win Ulster U21 Football Championship & Minor Football League for the First Time

1970 was a historic year for Fermanagh GAA. Between 1970 and 1971, Fermanagh contested six Ulster Finals winning its first Ulster Minor Football League title in 1970 against Armagh. That team was led by Ciaran Campbell and went on to reach the Ulster Minor Championship Final, accounting for Antrim, Armagh and Donegal before losing to Derry by 1-14 to 0-11. The goal was a late spectacular effort from Martin O'Neill, who also played a key role in St Malachy's Belfast defeating St Michael's Enniskillen in the MacRory Cup Final of that same year and has since went to become a household name for his success in another sport.

Four of that Minor team, including a 16-year-old Peter McGinnity, were also on the Under 21 team that swept all aside to win the Ulster U21 Football Championship for the first time. The team was: P Sheridan, C Campbell, P Reilly, J Courtney, M McGarrity, S Sheridan, S Flanagan, D McKenna, B Reilly, E McPartland, A Campbell, M Fox, E Treacy, P McGinnity, M Cassidy, D Campbell, H Kelly, G Gallagher and T Boyle.

The U21 Final was played against Cavan and Fermanagh emerged victorious on a scoreline of 0-13 to 0-08.

On 30th August 1979, Fermanagh (1-08) defeated Louth (1-05) in the All Ireland U21 Football Championship Semi Final in The Ramparts Dundalk.

On 4th October 1970, history was made as Fermanagh took part in their first ever All Ireland U21 Football Championship Final, which was played in Croke Park. Gabriel Brock records that Fermanagh appeared to be over-awed by the occasion and struggled against a bigger, faster and more experience Cork team and their task was made much harder when they lost Eamonn McPartland through injury early on. Trailing by 1-07 to 0-03 at half time, Fermanagh flattered for a spell with the aid of a strong breeze and cut the lead down to 4 points. However, Cork finished the stronger and won by 2-11 to 0-09. Those who scored for Fermanagh were: E Treacy 0-3, E McPartland 0-3, D McKenna 0-1, P McGinnity 0-1, D Campbell 0-1.

This was to be a disappointing experience for the young team. Yet the football ability was there and Fermanagh's selectors showed their faith in them by choosing eight of the Under 21 players for the National Football League game against Westmeath.


In 1971, Fermanagh would repeat their Ulster U21 Championship success by defeating Tyrone in the Ulster Final before losing to Cork again in the All Ireland Final.

Fermanagh have only won the Ulster U21 Championship on 3 occasions and the fact that two of those were secured by this gifted group of players in 1970 and 1971 shows just how special this group of players would be.


THE KICK OUT

AIM: To encourage teams to kick the ball further up the field from the kick out; To present opportunities for the skill of clean catching by bolstering the existing Mark rule.

Supporting evidence and rationale:

During the Allianz National Football Leagues, when the kick out was taken from the 20m line, there was an increase in the number of Marks claimed by teams compared to the 2018 Championship.

During the Allianz National Football Leagues 2019 there was also a significant increase in the number of contested kick outs (i.e. between both teams) compared to the recently concluded 2019 All-Ireland Championship.



THE SIN BIN


AIM: To reduce a rise in cynical play/'professional' fouling and implement a penalty 'on the day' which encourages behavioural change.

Supporting evidence and rationale:


On average during the 2019 NFL, teams with an extra player scored 2.9 points compared to 1 point for the opposition in the same period (i.e. during the period when an opponent was in the sin-bin).

The average 'ball in play' time during a sin bin throughout the Allianz National Football League 2019 (30 games analysed) was 5:15 - entirely consistent with the remainder of the game.

The proposed introduction of the Sin Bin also offers teams a greater level of equity in that it removes the effect of a strong group of substitutes who, under current rule, would replace any player who received a black card.



Black Card is shown



10 minute clock starts once the player has left the field of play. Game will re-commence at the same time that the Sin-Bin period commences.


THE ADVANCED MARK

AIM: To offer an incentive for the longer kicking of the ball into the opposition's defensive area and reward players who catch the ball cleanly under these circumstances with a Mark.

Supporting evidence and rationale:

During its trialling in the Allianz National Football Leagues 2019, this experimental rule provided for a 24% increase in the number of kick passes in the game (2019 NFL v 2018 C'ship) - 132 v 107 and, furthermore, it resulted in an increase in the number of contested foot passes (6%)

It provided for the first reduction in the ratio of hand passing to foot passing in ten seasons (3.5:1 in the 2018 C'ship to 2.9:1 NFL 2019), meaning teams were inclined to kick the ball more and hand pass it less than had been the case for at least the last decade.

Is minic a deirtear an seanfhocal seo ag déanamh tagairt do dhuine nuair a dhéantar buntréithe an duine a cheiliúradh agus a chuimhneamh. Deirtear go raibh daoine lách cineálta, go raibh siad fial flaithiúil nó nach raibh a sárú le fáil. Thig linn an rud céanna a rá faoin bhliain ait aisteach a bhí againn go dtí seo i mbliana.

Agus muid ag tabhairt faoi na chéad bhabhtaí de na Craobhacha Condae níor shíl éinne go mbeadh cúrsaí mar atá. Is iad na focail dheireannacha ag gach aon abairt na laethe seo, ‘agus aimsir Covid go fóill linn’. Ba coitianta an tuairim go mbeidh deireadh leis an diabhal tinneas seo míonna ó shin. Shíl cuid mhór daoine nuair a cuireadh na babhtaí deireannacha de na cluichí sraithe ar athló go mbeidh an saol ar ais mar is ceart roimh thús an tsamhraidh. Ní mar a shíltear, bítear ar an drochuair.

Níl cead ach ag 400 duine, na himreoirí, bainisteoirí agus lucht na bhfoirne san áireamh, freastal ar na cluichí. 300 de lucht tacaíochta an líon daoine a bheidh sna hardáin ag scairteadh in aird a gcinn nuair a rachaidh na foirne chun páirce. Is iomaí uair a deir imreoirí go gcuireann gáir an tslua faitíos orthu agus iad sa bhearna bhaoil ach b’fhéidir gur an mhalairt a bheith fíor an iarraidh seo. Cibé scéal é, is amhlaidh a bheidh na mothúcháin don dá fhoireann agus thig le duine faoin spéir a bheith cinnte nach bhfuil éinne, imreoir ar bith, cleachtaithe leis an aitmaisféar a bheidh rompu ar bheagán nó ar mhórán taithí acu.

Chuir an phaindéim deireadh le cuid mhaith rudaí i mbliana ina measc súid bhí ócáidí móra spóirt, féiltí agus na Coláistí Samhraidh fiú amháin ach sna luathlaethanta nuair a bhí an dianghlasáil faoi lán seoil ba é Cumann Lúthchleas Gael a bhí feiceálach, cabhrach agus ar an talamh sna bailtí beaga fud fad na tíre.

Daoine ag obair ar bhonn deonach a thug earraí do dhaoine i mbun scoiteachta ón ghnáthphobal. Níor chóir dearmad a dhéanamh choíche ar an ról a d'imir na saorálaithe do sciar suntasach den phobal. Is mór an trua nach féidir leis an lucht tacaíochta ar fad freastal ar na cluichí ach ní féidir an dul chun cinn atá déanta le seachtainí anuas a chur i mbaol.

Ar ais chuig cúrsaí ar an pháirc anois agus na cluichí Craobhacha. Cuirfear tús leis an aicsean ar an Aoine nuair a chuirfidh Eadarnaigh Naomh Íosaef agus Bealach na Leice Art Mac Murchadha in Inis Ceithleann. Bua gan choinne ag Bealach na Leice sa chluiche seo anuraidh mar sin beidh díoltas a lorg ag Eadarnaigh sa cheann sin. Cill Náile a bhain an Craobh Idirmheánach anuraidh ag imirt in aghaidh Béal Leice, foireann nár thaispeán mórán go dtí seo i mbliana. Ar an Domhnach, foireann craoibhe iad Seamróga Tigh Mór agus beidh siad ag iarraidh an lámh in uachtar a fháil ar Cumann Mhig Uidhir An t-lompú agus ansin an ceann mór, curaidh le cúig bliana anuas Doire Ó gConaile in aghaidh Ros Liath.

Sa Chraobh idirmheánach, ní nach ionadh gur deacair teacht amach as an chraobh seo. Luaitear an buaiteoir ón chluiche idir Baile an Irbhinigh agus Gaeil Inis Ceithleann chun an craobh a bhaint ach níl aon chinnteacht faoi sin. Cluichí comharsana idir Naomh Pádraigh agus Droichead Mhig Uidhir tá dianchluiche geallta sa cheann sin. Cupla bliain ó shin ba chluiche sinsear é Béal Cú in aghaidh Lios na Scéithe ach tig athrú ar chúrsaí go gasta. Cluiche suimiúl atá geallta in Inis Ceithleann ar an Domhnach buaiteoir ón Chraobh Sóisearach anuraidh Achadh Droim Sí in aghaidh iar-fhoireann sinsear Daimhinis.

Sa Chraobh Sóisearach, imreoidh na buaiteoirí ón dá chluiche in aghaidh a chéile chun áit a bhaint sa chluiche ceannais ach beidh cluichí cáilithe le himirt ag na foirne eile.

Go n-éirí leis na himreoirí, na bainisteoirí, na réiteoirí an lucht tacaíochta agus gach duine taobh thiar den aicsean.




